He leaves six other children and five grandchildren.

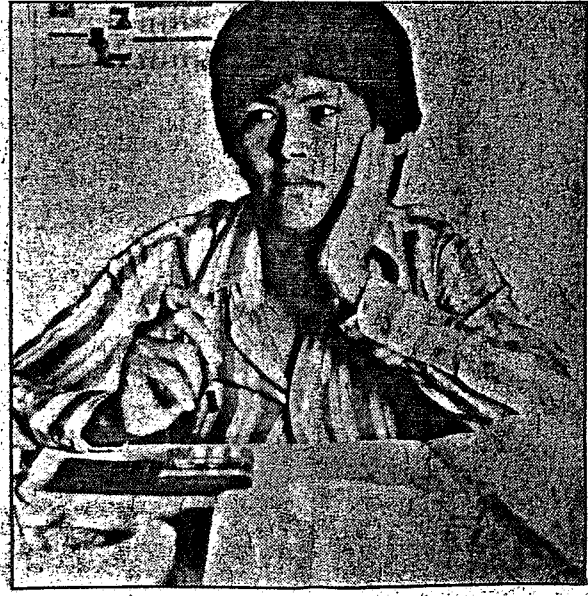
Datuk Sir Clough, who was born in Taiping, was a prominent leader of the Malaysian Ceylonese community.
